



Al Health Disparities


- 2.5 Million AI/AN ~ 2% of US population (US Census, 2015)
- Al/AN have much higher death rates than Whites.
 - Influenced by diabetes, smoking, drinking & social determinants (Espey et al, 2014).
- Leading causes of AI/AN deaths
 - heart disease
 - cancer
 - unintentional injury
 - diabetes
 - chronic liver disease & cirrhosis (Jacobs-Wingo et al 2015]
- Al die at higher rates than other American (IHS 2017)
- Missing & murdered indigenous women is gaining attention ~ has been ignored
- Opioid epidemic OD largest increase in mortality rates 2.7x
- Al life expectancy is 4.4 years < US All races (IHS 2017)
















American Indian/ Alaska Native Federal Spending (US General Accounting Office 2017)
